

CoolCrafting Luna's

100% Wool Ombre Snood with Velvet Trim

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Ingredients:

Instructions, 3 shades of Wool, 1 metre Velvet ricrac.



You will also need a pair of 4mm knitting needles, and a large eyed needle such as a yarn darning.

Please read through these instructions first. If you are a child, ask an adult if you are unsure.

Abbreviations

K = Knit

P = Purl

K2tog = Knit 2 stitches together

YFD = Yarn forward

Colours

Colour A Darkest shade

Colour B Mid shade

Colour C Lightest shade

Note on changing colour When you're ready to start working a new colour, simply leave the first colour and pick up the yarn for the second colour. Knit the first stitch. This stitch will look really loose when you first knit it, but keep knitting and when you're 5 stitches into the row you can tighten up the last stitch of the previous row and the first stitch on this row by pulling gently on the yarn tails. Trim the yarn tails to be about 6 inches. Tie the ends of the yarns together in a small knot. This will make it easy to weave your ends in securely later.

Knitting

Cast on 87 stitches in colour A - this will take about a metre of your yarn

1st Row Col A K1,*YFD, K2tog* to end - 87 stitches

2nd Row Col A K to end

3rd Row Col B K to end

4th Row Col A K to end

5th Row Col B K to end

6th Row Col B K to end

7th Row Col C K to end

8th Row Col B K to end

9th Row Col C K to end

10th Row Col C As 1st Row

Cast off knitwise on 11th Row using Col C

Making Up

Press the scarf out with a warm iron and a pressing cloth. Sew the scarf together to form a loop. The ends of yarn can be woven directly into your knitting. Thread a darning or large eyed needle with the end of the yarn and run it in and out in an inconspicuous place for an inch or two. Clip remaining excess yarn.

Halve your ricrac and Starting from the back seam thread through alternate holes on the bottom holes. Ensure that the velvety side of the ric rac is facing outwards and that there are no twists in the ribbon - it is probably easiest to thread and adjust a single hole at a time rather than do a few and pull through. Complete the circle . Repeat with the upper edge and the

remaining ricrac. Secure the ricrac to itself at the back seam with some cotton thread.

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
